Judge Blackburn was sworn in as the 40th County Judge of Bell County on January 1, 2019.

Judge Blackburn has a law degree from St. Mary's University and served as Killeen's city attorney. He has managed multi-million-dollar budgets for the cities of Killeen and Temple over the course of his career as a city manager for both those cities. From 2014 to 2018, he served as President and Chief Executive Officer for the Temple Economic Development Corporation. In all these positions, Judge Blackburn has helped bring over a thousand jobs and millions of dollars in private capital investment to the Killeen/Temple and Bell County area in general.

Judge Blackburn was born in 1957 in Abilene, Texas, to Donald and Shirley Blackburn. Judge Blackburn's father was a career military man who died in 1973 while serving on active duty in the US Air Force. His mother still lives in his hometown of Abilene, where she retired as a practicing registered nurse.

Judge Blackburn has lived in multiple places over the course of his life, including Canada, the Philippines, North Africa, and several cities across the U.S.

After graduating from Abilene Cooper High School in Abilene, Texas, Judge Blackburn attended Hardin-Simmons University in Abilene. He received a Bachelor of Arts with a double major in History and Political Science. Judge Blackburn then attended the American University in Washington, D.C., studying International Affairs. He capped off his academic career at St. Mary's University Law School in San Antonio, where he received his Juris Doctorate.

Before coming to Bell County, Judge Blackburn served as a city attorney in Texarkana and Plainview. It was in the early 1990's that Judge Blackburn and his wife Anne moved to Central Texas. Over the course of a decade, Judge Blackburn built his ties in Killeen as a city attorney, assistant city manager, deputy city manager and, finally, city manager. In 2005, he headed east to become the city manager of Temple. During his service as the Killeen and Temple City Manager, Judge Blackburn managed over 2,000 employees and 100 million-plus budgets. Judge Blackburn has successfully managed those cities thru times of high, rapid growth, as well as during the Great Recession of 2008-09.

Judge Blackburn retired as city manager in August 2014 and became President and Chief Executive Officer of the Temple Economic Development Corporation in 2015. While under Judge Blackburn's leadership, TEDC saw an unprecedented quarter-of-a-billion dollars of private capital investment in the community by new and existing businesses, as well as almost 1,500 jobs.

Judge Blackburn has served on numerous boards and commissions over the course of his professional career, to include the Killeen and Temple Chamber of Commerce Boards, the Killeen-Temple Metropolitan Planning Organization, the Association of the United States Army Central Texas Chapter of the Board of Governors, the Texas Association of City Attorneys to name a few.

Judge Blackburn now lives in rural northwest Bell County with his wife Anne. He has 4 grown daughters who live in Texas & NY.
